

DANIEL FABER is an Associate Professor of Sociology and Director of the Green Justice Research Collaborative at Northeastern University. His research is focused in the areas of political economy, environmental policy, social movements, classical and contemporary social theory, environmental justice, philanthropy, Central America and underdevelopment, and globalization studies. Dr. Faber has a long history of involvement with movements, non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and governmental agencies involved in the formation of environmental policy. He co-founded and worked as Research Director for the Environmental Project On Central America (EPOCA), Earth Island Institute (1984-90), and has published numerous works on the political ecology of Central America. He is the author of *Environment Under Fire: Imperialism and the Ecological Crisis in Central America* (Monthly Review Press, 1993), recognized by *Choice Magazine* as an “1993 Outstanding Academic Book of the Year on Latin America.” His most recent work is concerned with problems of environmental injustice in America, and includes the edited collection, *The Struggle for Ecological Democracy: Environmental Justice Movements in the United States* (Guilford Press, 1998). Dr. Faber has also served as a consultant to many foundations. In 2001 he produced a major report *Green of Another Color* that assessed relations between the foundation community and the U.S. environmental justice movement. He is also co-editor (with Deborah McCarthy) of a new collection entitled, *Foundations for Social Change: Philanthropy and Popular Movements in the United States* (Rowman & Littlefield, 2005). He also recently co-authored another major study entitled, *Unequal Exposure 2005: A Report on Environmental Injustices in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts*. The report makes a number of recommendations around the implementation of new environmental justice policies, some of which have been adopted by the state. The report also served as a cornerstone Governor Deval Patrick’s environmental platform. Dr. Faber is currently working on a new book global capitalism, neo-liberalism, and environmental justice politics in the new millennium. Dr. Faber is currently a Board Member of the Alliance for a Healthy Tomorrow (AHT), a broad-based coalition of citizens, scientists, health professionals, union officials, business leaders, and environmentalists working to implement a precautionary and preventive approach to environmental policy in Massachusetts. In 2006, Dr. Faber received the “Friend of the Earth and Champion of Environmental Justice Award” for his “path-breaking leadership and work in Environmental Justice in Massachusetts and beyond,” by Salem State College and HealthLink. He also received the “Champion for Justice Award,” granted by the Alliance for a Healthy Tomorrow for his contributions in forging new environmental policy initiatives in Massachusetts around safer alternatives to toxic chemicals and environmental equity. Dr. Faber has served as Coordinator of the Boston Editorial Group of CNS for over thirteen years.
